Itinerary	Seoullo 7017 → Bukchon Hanok Village → Gahoe Museum → Gyeongbokgung Palace
Minimum Number of Participants	7 participants
<p>Seoullo 7017 In the 1970s, an elevated road was built to connect the eastern and western sides around Seoul Station. However, the road was closed to road traffic due to safety issues. After this, rather than tearing down the existing structure, the road was transformed into Seoullo 7017, a new pedestrian walking experience.</p> <p>Bukchon Hanok Village Surrounded by Gyeongbokgung Palace, Changdeokgung Palace and Jongmyo Shrine, Bukchon Hanok Village is home to hundreds of traditional houses, called <i>hanok</i>, that date back to the Joseon Dynasty.</p> <p>Gahoe Museum Opened in 2002, Gahoe Museum has on exhibit, folk paintings and amulets reflecting the lifestyle and wishes of the Korean people from ancient times. Participants can enjoy folk painting on a fan.</p> <p>Gyeongbokgung Palace Built in 1395, Gyeongbokgung Palace is also commonly referred to as the Northern Palace because its location is furthest north when compared to the neighboring palaces. Gyeongbokgung Palace is arguably the most beautiful, and remains the largest of all five palaces.</p>

Samsung Innovation Museum exhibits the history and the future of such innovations brought by the electronics industry.</p> <p>LG Digital Park LG's 640,000-square-meter Digital Park is home to 10,000 employees working on projects related to televisions, mobile and auto components. A small part of Digital Park is LG's mobile assembly facility, the largest of its five mobile assemblies found around the world.</p>

Itinerary	Imjingak Park → The 3rd Infiltration Tunnel → Dora Observatory → Dorasan Station

<p>Imjingak Park Imjingak is a park that was made in 1972 to give consolation to homesick of refugees who fled North Korea during the Korean War(1950~1953). It locates about 7km to the south from the Military Demarcation Line and 0.5km from Imjingang Station.</p> <p>The 3rd Infiltration Tunnel The Tunnel, detected in 1978, is in the spot away 12km from Munsan and 52km from Seoul. Since 2002, this site has admitted tourists after arranging a modern DMZ Visual Hall, Symbolic Sculptures and Souvenir Shop.</p> <p>Dora Observatory Located at the northernmost in South Korea, the observatory allows you to get a closest glimpse of North Korea; you can view some urban areas of Gaeseong, Mt. Songhak, a bronze statue of Kim Il-Seong and the Gaeseong Industrial Complex.</p> <p>Dorasan Station The northernmost station in the South Korea on the Seoul-Uiju Line. You can see Mt. Dora and the barbed wire fence of the Southern Limit Line. In 2002, American President George W. Bush and South Korean President Kim Dae-Jung visited here together and sent a peace message to the North Korea.</p>
